Request for Proposal to perform Pulmonary Fit Testing

The Department of Health Services (DHS) located at Patten Health Clinic at the United States Merchant Marine Academy (USMMA) requires a request for proposal to perform on site Pulmonary Fit Testing of all incoming Plebe Candidates. The purpose of this testing is to determine respiratory fitness of incoming Plebe Candidates for the wearing of rebreathable air masks during firefighting operations & training.

USMMA will require assistance in providing an OSHA required medical clearance questionnaire and screening to be performed by NIOSH trained technician(s). Results of all testing will have a 72 hour turn-around time on pulmonary results.

All providers of an RFP will meet or exceed the standards for ATS –American Thoracic Society, OSHA and NIOSH National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health. Providers of an RFP must be able to provide interpretation, measurement, predicted values and graphs in digital data.

The successful bidder will provided respiratory clearance questionnaires in advance for distribution to plebes for completion prior to PFT. Completing the questionnaire prior to arrival will make the pulmonary screening by groups more time efficient.

2012 Respiratory Clearance Procedure Phase I

1. Approximately Two (2) weeks prior to scheduled on-site screening date, USMMA will provide a list of all plebes requiring pulmonary screening. The list will include first name, last name, Midshipman ID number and date of birth.

On-site Screening Procedure Phase II

1. Successful bidder will confirm dates with program administrator for on-site pulmonary screening of plebes.
2. Equipment and supplies will be shipped to USMMA, DHS for arrival approximately two (2) days prior to scheduled pulmonary screening date and will be stored at DHS.
3. Successful bidders Technician(s) will maintain log of plebe candidates (P/C) by group.
4. P/C's will provide first name, last name, Midshipman ID number and date of birth to technician.
5. Final results letter will be mailed to USMMA 72 hours from completion of pulmonary screening to program administrator.

Alternate II (Dec 2010). As prescribed in 12.301(b)(4)(ii), substitute the following paragraphs (d)(1) and (e)(1) for paragraphs (d)(1) and (e)(1) of the basic clause as follows:

(d)(1) The Comptroller General of the United States, an appropriate Inspector General appointed under section 3 or 8G of the Inspector General Act of 1978 (5 U.S.C. App.), or an authorized representative of either of the foregoing officials shall have access to and right to—

(i) Examine any of the Contractor's or any subcontractors' records that pertain to, and involve transactions relating to, this contract; and

(ii) Interview any officer or employee regarding such transactions.

(e)(1) Notwithstanding the requirements of the clauses in paragraphs (a), (b), and (c), of this clause, the Contractor is not required to flow down any FAR clause in a subcontract for commercial items, other than—

(ii) *Those clauses listed in this paragraph (e)(1).* Unless otherwise indicated below, the extent of the flow down shall be as required by the clause—
